

Conclusions

"Education and culture are key to building inclusive and cohesive societies, and to sustaining our competitiveness."

- stepping up mobility and exchanges, including through a substantially strengthened, inclusive and extended Erasmus+ programme;
- strengthening strategic partnerships across the EU between higher education institutions and encouraging the emergence by 2024 of some twenty 'European Universities', consisting in bottom-up networks of universities across the EU which will enable students to obtain a degree by combining studies in several EU countries and contribute to the international competitiveness of European universities;








Key elements of European Universities by 2025

- A shared, integrated, long-term joint strategy for education with links, where relevant, to research and innovation, and to society.
- Co-created by HEIs, student organisations, Member States and the Commission
- Systemic, structural and sustainable impact



Testing phase 1: Progress with the first call (2019)



EUR 85 million for 17 alliances (maximum EUR 5 million each, 3 years)



Deadline for submission 28 February 2019:

- 54 applications
- more than 300 HEIs involved, from all Member States
- different types of HEIs (e.g. research-based, technical, applied sciences, medical...)



Evaluation results published on 28 June: 17 selected European Universities



High Level Conference on 7 November 2019:

- kick-off and presentation of the 17 European Universities
- information session on the 2nd call for proposals

Success factors


- Relevance & level of ambition of common long term vision
- Transformational impact on institutions, at all levels
- Contribution to European Education Area, geographical balance
- Consistency between strategy and work plan of activities
- High involvement of students and staff at all levels
- Concrete deliverables after 3 years



A diverse spectrum of higher education institutions

- √ 48 eligible applications
 - Around 80% had between 5 and 8 partners, on average 6 partners
 - 2/3 comprehensive and research-intensive universities
 - ❖ 1/3 technical universities, universities in the fields of arts, universities of applied sciences, distance-learning
- √17 pilot European Universities
 - Around 90% have between 5 and 8 partners, on average 7 partners
 - ❖ 35% include a technical, applied sciences or art university
 - Small, medium-sized and large institutions involved
 - Previous cooperating partners have reached out to new partners





Transformational Impact

- Systemic, structural and sustainable impact
- Institution wide, going beyond individual departments and faculties
- Parity of esteem btw education and R&I
- Specific trans-disciplinary challenges (challenge-based approach)
- Aim to become EU champions
- Make the 'knowledge square' a reality

Education Research Innovation Service to society

Diversity of innovative governance models

- Common management and support structures
- Administrative, management, infrastructure and cultural changes
- Joint high-level boards, steering committees, strategy boards
- Co-creation governance model with students and staff



Embedded and seamless mobility

- 50% (sometimes 100%) target of student mobility
- More flexible and innovative mobility formats
- Multilingualism
- Automatic recognition
- EU student card initiative



Student-centred learning and teaching

- Pool courses/programmes/modules together
- Flexible, modular, personalised curriculum
- Combination of full joint degrees with micro-credentials
- Continuous learning
- Innovative pedagogies: mix of face-to-face and virtual, flipped classroom, transdisciplinary & transnational challenge-based co-creation teams



Knowledge co-creating teams

- Transdisciplinary and transnational knowledge co-creating teams of students, academics, researchers
- Wide diversity of associated partners:
 regions, cities, companies, NGOs, research centres
- Living labs
- Entrepreneursip, mentorship



Pilot EUROPEAN UNIVERSITIES - implementation

Funded through Erasmus+

- Transformative institutional changes
- Management of the alliance and set-up of a new governance to implement the common long-term strategy
- Transformation of education and training programmes: more innovative, transdiciplinary, challenge based, modular and personalised
- Embedded mobility of students and academic staff
- Dissemination to other HEIs

Funded through national/regional funding, Horizon 2020, or structural funds

- Research dimension
- Links to innovation ecosystems
- Adoption of open science practices
- Research and data infrastructure

Other Erasmus actions:

Mobilities, Strategic Partnerships, Knowledge Alliances, Erasmus Mundus, Joint Master Degrees

Other Horizon Europe Actions:

EIT-KIC, Marie-Curie, clusters/missions, all HE pillars



Testing Phase 2: Progress with the second call (2020)





Increased overall budget of EUR 120 million confirmed by Erasmus+ programme committee



Call preparation ongoing



Call publication in autumn



Full roll-out under the next MFF







Increased budget, subject to agreement of co-legislators



Possibility to reapply under the next MFF after a positive evaluation




Synergies with other national, European & private funding sources
