- → For forward looking institutional development
- → For **proactive advocacy** to make the case for enabling legal and funding frameworks at regional/national and European level

- What if?


Purpose: see what are possible and plausible future developments to take action in the present to shape the future according to your vision








What if, in the future, international university cooperation beyond the EU is further constrained due to geopolitical conflicts and foreign interference?

What if, in the future, a two-tier system emerges with a small number of big European federal universities and a larger number of smaller local higher education institutions?



What needs to be done at European level:

A renewed social contract for Europe and its universities

- 1. Strengthen the multilateral framework for cooperation
- Enhance the effectiveness of European multilevel governance
- Introduce a 'university check' prior to developing EU legislation
- Budget for ambitious higher education, research and innovation
- Promote universities' global role as responsible bridgebuilders and knowledge brokers
- Uphold the core values of institutional autonomy and academic freedom
- 7. Develop physical and virtual infrastructure
- Establish dedicated funding for university leadership development
